Entrepreneurial Advisory Board Visit

In an exciting development in line with our status of being an Entrepreneurial Specialist School (ESS) and our working relationship with Flinders University, Mount Gambier High School will host the 'Entrepreneurial Advisory Board Meeting' on Friday 30 October. This meeting will bring together the Chief Entrepreneur and advisors, along with local business, council and education sectors to explore aspects of regional entrepreneurship and business start-ups. This is a great way for our school to showcase and celebrate the work we have been doing over the last 18 months as an ESS and also what has been happening locally in our region. We will have a number of staff and students presenting to the board throughout the day.

The Entrepreneurship Advisory Board, including the Chief Entrepreneur, provide high level, independent advice to the South Australian Cabinet on entrepreneurship matters. The Entrepreneurship Advisory Board's high-level aims are to:

- Provide strategic advice to enable entrepreneurialism across all forms of business, industry and public sector
- Strengthen community awareness and appreciation of entrepreneurship and business through showcasing and championing South Australian businesses, entrepreneurial talent and the impact they have
- Recommend measures to connect South Australia's entrepreneurial ecosystem with networks nationally and internationally given the opportunities offered by the scale of global markets
- Advocate for the uptake of entrepreneurship education through strengthening communication with the school education system and tertiary education institutions

Capital Works Program (CWP)

We can confirm that the building contractor for our new works will be Kennett Construction. Kennetts completed our STEM works in 2018 and we are pleased to be working with this team again. Work will commence shortly on the upgrade of our science labs, canteen redevelopment and removal of existing transportable buildings. Next year will see the construction of two new stand-alone building in readiness for the year 7 student cohort in 2022. Building plans and designs will be on our website and Facebook pages in the near future.

Reports

Our school community is aware that written reports were not available last term. However, as a core part of teachers work, we continually assess and record student progress. It has been great to see students talk with teachers about their learning as it demonstrates an ownership and pride in their academic progress. We continue to invite parents to meet with teachers to share achievement, concerns and support for their children at any time throughout the term. We will be providing end of semester reports to students in years 8 - 11 at the end of this year via Daymap.

Attendance

Our attendance rates across all year levels are below our school and state targets and we recognise the direct correlation between attending classes, a successful education and ultimately a successful future. Parents play a very important role in meeting this expectation and we appreciate your understanding and rigorous support in making sure your child attends school, and classes, each day. We appreciate that sickness and other priorities interrupt school attendance from time to time and ask that the school is informed about absences as early as possible and that a meeting is requested should your child have ongoing attendance problems.

Dress Code

Mount Gambier High School has a very clear policy in regard to Dress Code and school expectations. All students are required to be in full dress code each day. 


