### Special Events

What a huge week it was for our HPE, grounds, canteen and ESS teams last week. The SAPSASA athletics carnival had nearly 500 athletes and over 200 staff and parents visit our school to compete on our perfectly presented grounds. Students involved in the athletics program were a huge help on the day, Kerran and Claudia were busy with organisational management and the home economics and canteen teams provided food for the crowd. The day was a brilliant showcase of what our school has to offer.

The Entrepreneurial, CLC and Flinders University teams combined to host seven members of the Entrepreneurial Advisory Board and over 30 local entrepreneurs to explore the strong link between education, mind-sets and learning opportunities in school and the wide world of work, business and innovation. The CLC hosted a large number of Mount Gambier High School students and staff throughout the day, who presented their learning journeys and aspirations for how we could shape the curriculum, as well as how we can provide pathways for students to have access to opportunities to put their entrepreneurial mindsets into action. Our visitors were appreciative, informed and highly impressed with the work happening at our school. The state's Chief Entrepreneur, Jim Whalley confirmed that he will accept the role as mentor for Mount Gambier High School entrepreneurial work into the future.

### Capital Works Program (CWP)

You might have noticed the construction fences going up around the school and we're excited to share that works are now underway to deliver major infrastructure upgrades to our school.

The \$6 million upgrade will provide students with world-class learning facilities, including refurbishment of 6 science labs and construction of 2 new buildings to house learning spaces.

We expect the upgrades will be completed in term 4 2021.

This is an exciting time for both our school and the wider community and we will continue to provide updates as construction progresses.

# YEAR 9 STEM EXCURSION

Last Wednesday students from the Year 9 STEM class had the opportunity to visit Mud Hole, Pine Cave and Fossil Cave in the Burrungule area.

Mount Gambier exists in a region surrounded by Geological wonders including over 50 cenotes (sinkholes) and around 800 caves, with only a handful of each being commonly known and explored. Students had the opportunity to visit these three lesser known sites, gaining an appreciation for our unique karst landscape.

While in the field students completed water quality testing, macroinvertebrate sampling, field sketches, looked for evidence of human influence and the presence of introduced species, and gathered a series of measurements, including using GPS location tracking for mapping purposes. It was a beautiful day to be out in the sun enjoying our local environment and all students showed interest in what they were doing.




