

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

It is with great pleasure that I have the opportunity of communicating to you in our first newsletter of 2021.

The new school year has started in a busy, positive and productive manner with students quickly settling into the school's work and learning expectations. Prior to students starting this year all staff were actively involved in strategic planning meetings focusing on "Attending to Culture". As a result of these meetings, it was agreed that the following expectations would be strongly actioned and supported at our school:

- School Dress Code all students are required to wear the correct attire in accordance with our Dress Code policy. I encourage all parents and students to re-visit our "Dress Code" and "Dress Code Brochure" available on our website.
- **Positive Behaviour** our staff are highly skilled and dedicated in what they do. It is important to recognise that responsible and respectful behaviour by all participants in a classroom environment is essential for successful learning outcomes. Likewise, every student represents Mount Gambier High School before and after school and that same responsible and respectful behaviour is expected. To provide these successful outcomes for all our students we will action positive behaviour support.
- Mobile Phone Policy it is the responsibility of the person owning a mobile phone to be respectful of the environment they are in. Thank you to parents and students for your support with our strong focus on mobile phones being silent, off and out of sight in classrooms and during learning activities. This has been a focus for the last three years and will continue, as this has a positive impact on the levels of attention and effort on learning.
- Movement "On" and "Off" our school site We have a duty of care for every student. Movement off-site without appropriate permission and/or not following designated sign out processes is unacceptable.
- A litter free environment As \$6million worth of demolition, reconstruction and re-development occurs at our site it is particularly important to mention that every endeavour will be given to support a litter free, well maintained learning environment for everyone to enjoy. In particular, high caffeine/ sugar drinks have become litter concerns, not to mention the unhealthy aspect associated with these drinks. These drinks will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day if seen being consumed during school time.

We look forward to your support in implementing these expectations and further instilling "Pride of Place" at Mount Gambier High School.

SENIOR SCHOOL INFORMATION

All senior students have study lessons where they are not in subject lessons. The purpose of uncommitted lessons is for students to complete assessment work, revise subject matter and prepare for upcoming lessons. It is an expectation that all students remain at school during these times, as well as recess and lunch. The intention is for all students to develop sound work habits in order to complete set tasks and be successful in their learning. There are staff members available to assist students during their study lessons.

If a student needs to leave for an approved reason such as illness or a medical appointment, they must have a written note, and show this when they sign in and/or out.

Stage 2 students are expected to be present from home group until 3.20pm each day for the first two weeks to ensure all administrative matters are addressed and completed. Home Study will commence

on Monday of week 3. Home Study for all Year 12 students will be reviewed on a regular basis. Continuation of Home Study will be based on attendance, work completion, teacher concerns and behaviour.

There is no Home Study for Stage 1 students. Students will use the year to demonstrate their skills and abilities to be eligible for Home Study as Stage 2 students.

Modified Swimming Carnival

STEM SCHOLARSHIP AND SPACE PROGRAM SUCCESS


ENTREPRENERIAL SPECIALIST SCHOOL NEW SUBJECTS

2021 marks a very exciting time for our Entrepreneurial Specialist School as we embed entrepreneurial subjects. All year 8 students will complete one term of Innov8. This subject has been designed in collaboration with Flinders University. Innov8 is an unique learning opportunity for students to experience the world of innovation and entrepreneurship. Students will become more aware of themselves and the world around them and discuss real world topics and problems. Innov8 focuses on developing students' entrepreneurial mindset and skills through creative play and innovative challenges, which in turn will be transferable into all other subject areas.

Students then have the opportunity to continue their entrepreneurial learning journey in year 9 with our semester elective Incub8. Incub8 builds on the entrepreneurial mindset and skillset established in Innov8. Incub8 takes a more structured approach and outlines three different groups of entrepreneurs, environmental, social and business. Students will undertake research into each of these groups and engage with guest speakers in each area. Incub8 will encourage students to formulate and ask their own questions through an individual inquiry approach rather than just answering them along with investigating and finding their own problems before they begin to solve them.

We look forward to seeing students achieve success in these subjects as they take on the problems of the world.

RURAL YOUTH AMBASSADORS PROGRAM



At the beginning of 2020, I was fortunate enough to be chosen in the inaugural South Australian Rural Youth Ambassadors Program, facilitated by The Country Education Partnership (CEP). The program aims to develop the leadership skills of rural and remote young people, as well as providing a collective voice for students to discuss, and collaborate on strategies surrounding issues affecting country education.

As a group, our goal was to contribute to an idea or project that improves the learning for all students in rural South Australia. Due to the effects of COVID-19, we were unable to travel to Adelaide each term, as previously planned. However, we were able to link up through an online platform on a number of occasions throughout the year. This included having the opportunity to speak with the Minister of Education for South Australia, the CEO of the Department for Education, as well as a number of other members from the Department for Education.

I also had the opportunity to present at the South Australian Area Schools Conference, be a part of a working group for the Rural Inspire Initiative and take part in a careers study being conducted by Curtin University in Western

Australia. Along with this, I will be travelling to Adelaide in week 3 of this term to attend a face-to-face forum with 10 other students from across South Australia. I was also lucky enough to be selected in the National Rural Youth Ambassador Program, involving 20 students from across South Australia, Victoria, and New South Wales. This will involve travelling to Canberra in week 5 of this term, to meet with senior bureaucrats and politicians.




