

# **FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

#### To our School Community

Welcome back everyone to term 2, a very exciting stage in Mount Gambier High Schools further improvement strategy and the continuation of existing processes put in place from last term to make our school "the learning space to be".

As mentioned in our last newsletter, advertising for the new principal at Mount Gambier High School is now underway. The panel, led by Adam Box, Education Director, will soon come together to review applications and go through the process of deciding on a successful applicant. Graeme Dowie, parent of students at Mount Gambier High School and member of our Governing Council, will represent the voice of parents within our school community on this panel. He comes with extensive experience participating in principal panels and has a vested interest in ensuring the best person wins this job. I will keep you informed on the next stages of this process as they occur.

Strategic planning for 2022 has commenced with advertised positions in process at the moment including:

- 10 new teaching positions to be advertised to fill new and existing positions for 2022
- Junior School Assistant Principal advertised for commencement Semester 2, 2021, for a tenure of four and a half years
- The HPE Coordinator position, held by Jan Longbottom, has been successfully rolled over for another five years. Congratulations Jan!

A new Timetable Restructure Team has been formed to look at re-shaping our present seven line timetable to a more efficient six line structure for the start of 2022. The intention of this change in timetable structure is to:

- Streamline the choice of subjects for students in 2022
- Create a more cost effective timetable and staffing structure
- Best support Middle Schooling and Senior Schooling pedagogical practices
- Subject sharing and collaboration with Grant High School
- Better support for teacher workloads and therefore maximising student learning environments where possible.

Internal re-structure of staff roles and responsibilities have been implemented this term to support the development of curriculum, planning and programming for Year 7s into High School starting next year.

#### Building Developments

- Our existing school canteen has been renovated into a contemporary looking space presently called "The Café".
- Existing science classrooms/laboratories have been refurbished and are now

- Painting works to the front end of our school have been undertaken, with the science block recently being completed in conjunction with the classroom/laboratory upgrade. It is envisaged that more painting works will be undertaken soon.

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## ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATIONS

Sarah also laid flowers on behalf of our school at a ceremony at the Boer War Memorial on Bay Road, which started at 9am. After the completion of this ceremony, she continued on to lay flowers at the site of the Airmen's War Graves in the Lake Terrace Cemetery, to honour the memory of the four men buried there. Geoffrey David Abbott (of NSW) drowned off Port Macdonnell in May 1943 as a result of a training accident and John Thomas Walton (of Qld), Brian John Eaton and Henry Neville Lord (both of Vic) were killed in August 1945 when their Beaufort bomber crashed soon after taking off from Mount Gambier.
