FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As we reach the midway point of term 3, significant developments are in action and planning is in place that will change the way we operate at our site in the future.

New 6-Line Timetable structure

In 2022 our school community will experience a new, streamlined timetable structure that is better suited to the young learner, supportive of improved teaching loads and greater capacity to share resources with other sites.

The basic structure is represented in the diagram below.

Fundamental improvements to this new structure include:

- Lesson 1 will start at 8.45am every day. Punctuality and readiness to this first lesson will be expected.
- No longer will we have 15-minute homegroup periods every morning. Lesson I will be the first contact for all students. Attendance will be recorded during this period.
- All lessons will be 80-minute blocks of learning. Each lesson will come off a break and go into a break.
- Morning break starting at 10.05am for 20 minute, consistent with research indicating young adolescence become hungry earlier.
- Lunchtime breaks do not need to be long, 30 minutes allows time for lunch, toilet break and free time.
- Afternoon break starting at 1.35pm for 20 minutes gives students "refresh time" in the afternoon with completion at the end of the day at 3.15pm.

Online Subject Selection Process

This year in line with improving processes and practices at our school, we have introduced online subject selections for 2022 for all Mount Gambier High School students. All students have already completed the step 1 Subject Selection process that indicates what subjects our students are interested in for next year. This data informs us of the most popular subjects that will run in 2022 and those subjects that won't have enough interest to run. Step 2 Subject Selection (starting soon) will invite all students to select online their final subject choices for 2022. This streamlined process has and will:

- Fully automate and fast track semi-paperless practices
- Provide valuable data for future reference and planning
- Provide final timetables from subject selections for staff, students and parents/caregivers well before the end of the year
- Highlight staffing needs for 2022 at a much earlier stage.

Middle Schooling Development

As we prepare for year 7 enrolments in 2022, Mount Gambier High School is heavily investing in the development of Middle Schooling. With the shift to a 6-line timetable structure teachers are seeing the opportunity of using the 80 minute lesson blocks as that perfect time to integrate subjects through careful lesson planning that provide more rewarding, stimulating learning opportunities for our students. Significant work has already been done in this highly exciting learning space.

Buildings and Facilities Developments

Our new middle school building located between the Miller building and our southern oval is in the final stages of completion and gives our staff ample time to set up the new Middle School precinct at Mount Gambier High School, ready for start in 2022.

The new Flexible Learning Centre located on the eastern side of our site is steadily developing shape and building expectations are to complete mid term 4.

You would have noticed a developing change in the front of our school. Thanks to our Grounds Persons, Mick Ashby and Glenn Leggett and Business Manager, Steph McIntosh, improvements have been made throughout out site. Their strategic planning and actions throughout this year have seen significant improvements, especially in the "face" of our school.

New School Uniform - New School Image

As we approach 2022 our new Lowes school uniform and its implementation continues to build. Please be aware of the following information as we transition to this significant image upgrade.

From the start of 2022 Mount Gambier High School will have a new uniform. Governing Council have approved a Uniform Policy that will replace the current Dress Code policy. All new students to Mount Gambier High School will be required to wear the exclusively supplied Lowes uniform from the start of 2022. Existing students

will have a two year period up until the beginning of 2024 to phase out their existing uniform items. Jeans will no longer be a part of the uniform policy from the start of 2022.

We anticipate the Lowes uniform to be available for purchase through the Mount Gambier store prior to the end of the year. Further communication about this will be shared in the future.



Staffing Updates

The panel to select our new principal has just formed and will follow its process over the next few weeks to make that important selection for our school community's future. As soon as there is an announcement, I will send communications out to advise of the final outcome.

These are just a few of the strategic changes being actioned to improve processes and practices. I continue to look forward to working with everyone surrounding the ongoing zoned focus to the continuous improvement of Mount Gambier High School.

FREE ONLINE LEARNING TOOLS


