COVID-19

Schools are a reflection of their communities. Just as the community has faced challenges with COVID-19, so too have we as a school. We have experienced a number of cases since school returned, and as I write we are currently seeing a number of cases at year 7 in particular.

It is important that we all continue to follow the SA Health advice and Department for Education expectations. I'm sure that you are well aware of these. Mask wearing continues to be a priority for us, as it is in the community. I appreciate the support that all parents are providing to ensure that their child understands the need for mask wearing and are compliant with it. Can I also reinforce that students must have masks on at all times on school buses.

A reminder that if your child has any cold or flu like symptoms, even mild, they must stay home from school. Any young person with symptoms needs to be sent home from school, and parents will be contacted if this need arises. We appreciate the ongoing support from parents with this.

We are required to notify parents when their child is a classroom contact of a confirmed positive case. Currently we are doing this by text as quickly as we can after the case confirmation and are following this up with an email. You may receive more than one text and email. This is because there have been a number of cases

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INTERHOUSE ATHLETICS CARNIVAL

After winning the 2021 "lan Gould Interhouse Athletics competition" by one point, Tower again proved too strong for their opponents, led by their captains., Zeb Chant and Sarah Ritter, whilst being well supported by their Vice Captains, Jamie Williamson and Chelsea Owen. Over the course of the competition participation from all teams was high, with many pushing through the hot and humid conditions on Thursday and braving the wet weather on Friday to achieve personal bests.

Whilst the weather was not overly favourable for the competition on Friday, both staff and students took it in their stride, pushing through to ensure another successful Mount Gambier High School carnival was held. Some events were restricted for student safety, with only the Sack Race and Tug O War novelty events cancelled.

The addition of the new under 13 years age group only added to the success and atmosphere of the carnival, with many of the younger students getting involved in their first taste of a High School Athletics Carnival. These students must be commended for their efforts over the two days of competition.

Year 12 student, Hayden Crowe won the Craig Elliott Perpetual Award for the third year in a row. This award recognises the Most Outstanding Individual Performance of the carnival. Hayden's performances in the Open Boys 400m was outstanding, as he claimed the new record in this event in very wet conditions. The previous mark of 52.60s was held by John Shepherdson and had stood since 1969 (the oldest record for the carnival). Hayden set a new time of 51.59s.

Other records to fall during the carnival were:

Lara Wilson (16 Year Girls Discus): old record 25.72m; new record 27.35m.

Cooper Harris (13 Year Boys Long Jump): old record 4.36m; new record 4.43m.

In Week 8, Mount Gambier High School will host the 77th Annual South East Zone Athletics Carnival where we look forward to seeing some strong competition between all of the schools involved. Our athletics team will also compete in the SSSA Athletics Carnival in Adelaide in Week 11 if COVID restrictions are lifted.
