### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### Official Opening Capital Works

On Thursday 9 June our new building works which were made possible by the \$6 Million Capital Works Project were officially opened by The Hon Blair Boyer MP, Minister for Education, Training and Skills.



The redevelopment included the construction of two new buildings as well as refurbishment of science labs and the café space. These wonderfully new revamped spaces are used by students across all year levels providing not just a pleasant environment in which to work, but also contemporary teaching and learning spaces.

Continuing with a tradition at the school, our newest buildings and our upgraded science laboratories have been named in honour of previous staff members. Mary Anne Fenwick, Toni Vorenas and Bill Downs have all made significant contributions to Mount Gambier High School and the lives of hundreds of students



Mary Anne spent over 25 years at Mount Gambier High School commencing as an English teacher for three years in the early 1970s, before returning to complete her teaching career, working in roles such as Junior School Assistant Principal, Acting Principal and finishing as Deputy Principal prior to retiring in 2019.

Mary Anne was a key supporter and champion of our New Arrivals (IELP) Program, which has been a very successful program for many Congolese and Karenni students over the years. These students were well supported by Mary Anne when integrating into mainstream schooling through curriculum and activity offerings. In the early years of this program, Mary Anne would also attend cultural activities outside of hours, further developing the connection between these families and Mount Gambier High School.

Mary Anne was one for equality, often being the advocate for our students when they didn't have the opportunity to speak up.

Over many years at Mount Gambier High School, Mary Anne was involved in numerous committees, including Governing Council and overseeing our long-standing Glossop Exchange. Involvement in many of these committees was brought on by her roles within the school, however, her will to do her best for Mount Gambier High School was the reason she joined many others.

Toni Vorenas has been both an educational and business leader in the local community. Toni played a pivotal role as Leader of the Senior School during the principal-ship of Garry Costello. She, along with the other leaders and teachers,

supported the school to achieve "results too startling to ignore" through a culture of care, high expectations and understanding of how our brains work. An outstanding classroom teacher, her mentoring in pedagogy and leadership has had a profound impact on the whole school community. Additionally, in collaboration with John Pocock, Toni developed and taught in the 'Link' after school program. This program supported students that had disengaged from schooling with the opportunity to reconnect with their education and achieve incredible personal success.

Furthermore, 'Link' was one of the prototypes that was later used to create what we now know as Flexible Learning Options (FLO).

Following a successful career as a leader and educator, Toni went on to create the iconic Metro Bakery and Cafe. In her time at the Metro, Toni has not only created a significant meeting and social space for the Mount Gambier community, she has continued to provide pathways for a range of people from diverse backgrounds and experiences. Toni's work at Metro now cements her as a leader within the community who has supported an untold number of Mount Gambier community members as a leader, collaborator and mentor.

Bill Downs was a student at Mount Gambier High School in the 1960's. During his time as student at the school, Bill was captain of his sporting house as well as some of the Mount Gambier High School sporting teams. Upon graduation Bill went to Adelaide to earn his Science and Teaching degrees and returned to teach at Mount Gambier High School in 1972. During his time here he taught Geology, Maths, Science and Biology. He was also the coach of several successful State teams for Cricket and Football, and mentored many new teachers over the years. In 2007 Bill retired from teaching after having been both a student and teacher at Mount Gambier High School for over 40 years. Unfortunately, in 2020 after battling a long-term serious illness, Bill passed away and is missed by many of his past students and colleagues across the local community.

We thank Mary Anne, Toni and Bill for their service to the school community over many years and for the legacy they leave.

#### Covid-19

The mask wearing mandate in secondary schools ended on Monday 30 May. Whilst masks are no longer compulsory, teachers and students may continue to wear them should they wish to do so. - Undertake testing as soon as possible.
- Inform us if your child tests positive. If your child tests positive they must remain isolated for 7 days and follow SA Health instructions.

It is still an expectation that you notify the school if your child tests positive. We continue to provide a single notification to families at the end of the day that lists the year levels affected by COVID-19 cases that day. This is a requirement of the Department for Education.

#### THE BERRI EXCHANGE
