Year 12 Farewell Assembly

A whole school assembly will be held on Monday, 31 October 2022 to celebrate our year 12 cohort and farewell them from Mount Gambier High School.

Last Official Day

Please note the last official day for year 12 students is Thursday, 3 November 2022. In subjects where students have no exams, they may be required to attend sessions with their teachers beyond the last official day to complete final assignments. This will be at the discretion of their subject teachers.

Year 12 Breakfast

The Year 12 Breakfast will be held the morning of Friday 4 November from 7.45am until 9.15am at the Jens Hotel. There will be no formal lessons scheduled on this day. Students will not be permitted at school after the breakfast unless they are fully engaged in a study program. If students wish to study or meet with teachers they are expected to be in full school uniform. Inappropriate behaviours on this day will have consequences applied in line with the school's Behaviour Management Policy. This may include exclusion from exams and the Year 12 Formal in November.

Final Exams

Exams begin on Monday, 7 November with the last exam held on Wednesday, 16 November 2022. Full school uniform is required during exams and no mobile phones or smart watches will be permitted. Exams will occur on the SACE Floor, as well as rooms 23 and 32 as required. For all online exams, students must ensure their laptop is fully charged.

Laptop/Book Returns and Lockers

Students will need to return their school laptop to the IT Office and all books to the Collaborative Learning Centre by Friday, 18 November 2022. Lockers are also required to be cleaned out and locks removed by this date.

Year 12 Formal

The school year will conclude with the Year 12 Formal to be held at the Barn Palais on Saturday, 19 November 2022. This will be our official recognition of the completion of students' schooling and is an opportunity for students, parents/caregivers and staff to celebrate together. Tickets can be purchased through the Student Office.

BIOLOGY FIELD TRIP

Late last term the Stage 1 Biology B class enjoyed a day out exploring local areas of environmental significance, and had the chance to apply their classroom learning in the field.

Students were joined by staff from Landscape SA who led the morning sessions, exploring the importance of remnant vegetation, keystone species and wetlands at both Penambol Conservation Park and Piccaninnie Ponds. Students collected samples, identified plant and macroinvertebrate species and considered existing management practices.

In the afternoon students participated in a citizen science project where they set up transects and quadrats at Finger Point Beach near Port Macdonnell to sample and determine the micro-plastic load present along the strandline (high tide line). This information can be used to build a bigger picture of the impact and spread of plastic pollution in the world's oceans. Tourists at the beach even became involved in our work, overhearing our discussion about plastic and being motivated to pick up all larger plastic pollution from the beach, which they gave to us to properly dispose of.
