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#### REMEMBRANCE DAY

In keeping with tradition, Mount Gambier High School recognised the significance of Remembrance Day by the laying of a wreath at the Vansittart Park War Memorial and through a whole school assembly conducted in the school gym. The school assembly, led by 2023 Elected Vice-Captains, Cooper Sneddon and Zarly Jones began with the Acknowledgement of Country. Jayden Manifold and Bella Shaughnessy read the stories of two Mount Gambier High School ex-scholars and Anna Anbu read the poem "In Flanders Fields" before those assembled showed their respect through the traditional minute's silence.

2023 Elected School Captain, Chelsea Owen was given the honour of reading the Ode at the Vansittart Park service. Year 10 student, Jorja Owen and 2023 Elected School Captain, Saw Hoe Bay laid a wreath on behalf of Mount Gambier High School staff and students. Following the ceremony, Hoe Bay, Chelsea and Jorja joined with School Captains from Compton Primary School for short ceremonies, first at the Boer War Memorial on Bay Road and later at the Lake Terrace Cemetery War Graves.

Mount Gambier RSL have been keen to raise awareness about the local Boer War Memorial on Bay Road. The Boer War was fought in South Africa from 1899 to 1902. Six local volunteers lost their lives in this conflict. The local Boer War Memorial was officially opened by Mount Gambier local Colonel Howland, who had been commanding officer of the First South Australian Mount Rifles in South Africa.

The Lake Terrace Cemetery War Graves are the final resting place of four Air Force trainees who were killed near Mount Gambier while serving in World War II. These men were all from interstate and so, for years, local Air Force veterans such as Charlie Miller and Jack Hopgood held a small service in their honour so their families could be assured that they had not been forgotten. Charlie and Jack have now passed away, but our two schools have decided to continue the tradition they began.

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# UNI SA STEM INNOVATION EXPERIENCE NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Our STEM Innovation Experience (STEMIE) team were crowned winners at the National STEMIE final last Thursday in Adelaide, after successfully winning the regional final earlier this term. The theme for this year's STEM based tasks was 'Revolutionary Resources for Future Generations'.

Team members Zeb Chant, Dylan Sawyer, Nate Whitehead, Molly Antonio, Jordan Harmer, Maria So, Blu Nay Say and Eryne Carrigan-Kemp worked together throughout term 3 to complete 20 tasks to qualify for the regional final where they showcased their learning.

They completed complex STEM challenges including designing and conducting a practical science experiment to electroplate an iron nail with copper, engineering a transport system using Lego and VEX robotics, programming an Arduino environmental awareness system device to keep workers safe in mines and using spreadsheets to predict future supply and demand of electricity in 2030 for South Australia. A highlight was the mock social media campaign that bonded the team together with their favourite 'Teamwork makes the Dreamwork' hashtag.

After presenting their learning at Regional Showcases the winning teams from across South Australia, Victoria and Queensland qualified for the STEMIE Finals held at The University of South Australia, Magill Campus.

At the National final students took part in a series of unseen STEM challenges in an escape room meets amazing race style competition. Mount Gambier High School were the winners this year, making them the first school to win the finals twice, having previously taken out the title in 2016. This year was the first year interstate teams have been involved in STEMIE.

"We were a little shocked to take out the National Title by such a large winning margin (16mins). The challenges are designed to be completed by a team within 2 hours so to have our team finish in an hour and 11 minutes we were really proud of the efforts from each team member," Zeb Chant, Year 11.

"The STEMIE experience was a fun, technical challenge that allowed me to use my skills and knowledge of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. The team began working on the challenges for the Regional competition back in term 2, so to win the regional competition and then travel to Adelaide for the national competition was a great end to a good 6 months of hard work," Molly Antonio, Year 11

"We would like to thank Mrs Henman and all the other teachers that helped us to reach the National finals. Without Mrs Henman's encouragement and guidance we would not have been as successful," Jordan Harmer, Year 10.


