

Hello from Kym Grant, 2023 MGHS Principal

I am extremely excited to be returning to Mount Gambier High School as the new Principal. It was great to meet some staff, students and parents in my recent visit to the school and I felt very welcomed by all. I was impressed by the positive attitude of the students and teachers and feel privileged to now be the principal of this school, a school that provided me with the confidence and skills to pursue my leadership career some 20 years ago.

I come to the school with 34 years as an educator, 21 years as principal in a variety of rural and remote schools both large and small. For the past five years I have been the Principal of Mark Oliphant College, a large B-12 school in the northern suburbs of Adelaide. My move to Mount Gambier High School will no doubt present a range of new challenges and experiences. However, in saying this, one does need to at times challenge themselves, experience new and different things in order to grow and as such the decision to come to Mount Gambier High School was an easy one.

Next year will be an important year as we look to consolidate and build on the excellent work of the school in supporting students, staff, and parents/caregivers. In any organisation that is actively seeking to further improve there are always things to build upon, opportunities to explore new ways of doing things based on current research as well as staff, student and community input and support. My initial few weeks at Mount Gambier High School will be spent talking to staff, parents and particularly students to ascertain what it is like to be a learner at the school. This information will be used to further enhance our site directions for the year and where we hope to be within five years. The task then will be to create the



conditions for optimising the level of challenge and support that will enable those goals to be realised. I hope to bring a renewed sense of optimism in moving the school forward in its improvement journey, working alongside staff, students, parents/ caregivers and the wider community to effect positive change, and to promote the important role that public education plays in contributing to a vibrant and sustainable community.

I would also like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the work undertaken by Annette Ryan in her role as principal this year. Much work has already been achieved which has made my transition a very smooth one.

To celebrate National PE Week earlier this term, our school participated in a number of local South East Zone competitions.

This day saw 42 students represent the school across these different sports. As this was the first year we had the year 7 students involved, the introduction of Buroinjin was a highlight with the students thoroughly enjoying this sport. This quick moving game was played on the Hockey turf and by the end of the day this end zone game was a student favourite. Playing across multiple fields at Blue Lake Sports Park, the Ultimate players deserve a big congratulations for playing through some tough conditions, which meant the playing implement was often changed to allow games to continue.

Two teams of four attended the Lawn Bowls competition on Wednesday at the Mount Gambier RSL Bowling Club. Whilst we weren't victorious overall in this competition, our students demonstrated improvement across the day. A big thank you to the volunteers from the Bowling Club who gave up their time to support our students.



The annual Festival of Sport was conducted on Thursday, hosted by Penola High School. Our year 9s participated in Touch Football, both boys and girls, and we also took a mixed Volleyball team for the year 10 competition. These 26 students enjoyed the day, playing a number of games, demonstrating good game development and understanding as the day progressed. A touch coaching session run by participating schools' staff at the beginning of the day upskilled the students and enabled games to be played from a good standard right from game 1.

Meanwhile at school Miss Kennedy organised a popular lunchtime 3 on 3 Basketball competition in the gym. Well done to Sae Nay Mya who won the longest throw on the Southern Oval with a 24.9m throw (of the rubber boots) It was fantastic to see so many students come out to participate in this. One of the highlights of the week was the Staff vs Student Volleyball match in the gym to round out the week. Miss Jenkins team valiantly tried to outplay the students with various tactics and skill but the student team outmaneuvered them to run out winners. Well done to the talented students.

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SWIMMING CARNIVAL

The 2022 Modified Swimming Carnival will take place at the Nangwarry Swimming Pool on Wednesday 14 December for our year 7 and 8 students. All items remaining at the end of the school year will be donated to charity or thrown away.



Cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package's ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).



Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.



Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

Please note this delivery timeframe is dependent on proofing and additional photography days at your school.



Phone and online support options available for people who are not able to attend our service inperson.


