

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome all to the start of the 2023 school year at Mount Gambier High School. A special welcome to new students and their families to our school. I am looking forward to getting to know you and your children, and together with our



staff, help make a difference with their learning, care and development. It has been great already meeting so many students and parents, and feeling very welcomed by all. I have been impressed by the positive attitude of our students, staff and the community, and feel privileged to be the principal of the school. I come to Mount Gambier with 34 years as an educator and 23 years as principal in a variety of rural, and remote schools, both large and small. For the past five years I worked as the Principal of Mark Oliphant College, a large school comprising students from birth to year 12, in the Northern Suburbs of Adelaide.

Mount Gambier High School is a special place for me having worked here some years ago. The school was responsible for providing me with the necessary skills and dispositions to pursue a role in the principalship, so the decision to come back was an easy one. In saying this, I am sure the school will provide a new set of challenges and experiences for me which I am looking forward to.

2023 is an important year as we look to consolidate and build on the excellent work of the school in supporting students, staff and families. In any organisation that is actively seeking to further improve there are always things to build upon and opportunities to explore new ways of doing things based on current research and community feedback. My initial few weeks at the school will be spent talking to staff, parents and particularly students to ascertain what it is like to be a learner at the school. This information will be used to determine not only our site direction for this year but also where we hope to be within five years. The task will then be to create the conditions for optimising the level of challenge and support that will enable those goals to be realised. Whilst there is a long journey ahead, I am buoyed by the sense of optimism from staff, students and parents in ensuring Mount Gambier High School becomes an outstanding public school, one of which our community can be suitably proud.

Our year 7 cohort began their high school journey with a staggered start and induction day last Monday. The students were involved in a range of induction activities across their scheduled subjects and Impact classes.



GOOD HYGIENE IN PE

PE Classes

For best hygiene practices it is recommended that all students participating in PE and Specialist Sports Classes change into clean, comfortable and appropriate clothing to participate in their lessons. When the lesson is finished students are asked to then change back into their Mount Gambier High School Uniform in a timely manner. Outlined below are a few facts in regards to gym clothing/trainers.

Trainers

Our feet contain the highest concentration of sweat glands, which can create a hot and sweaty environment and the ideal atmosphere for fungus and bacteria to thrive. To prevent germs harbouring in your trainers, you should allow your trainers to dry out between each use. If you exercise every day or even twice a day, you should consider having two pairs of trainers, which you alternate between. You should also always wear socks and wash them on a high wash - above 60°C - after each use. There is no hard and fast rule for when to wash trainers, if indeed they can be washed.

Gym Clothes

Your workout clothes are a key source of germs, since they absorb your body's sweat as well as other bacteria found in the environment. Germs are more likely to harbour on polyester sports clothing, causing odour as opposed to cotton materials. When washing polyester clothes a washing temperature above 60 degrees is ideal to kill bacteria. If you practise good hygiene and opt for high-quality clothing, your gym kit should stay fresh for longer. Do not let your children share gym kits with friends - if one has a skin infection it can be passed to others. Containing items such as trainers in a separate plastic bag within your gym bag will stop harmful bacteria from spreading. You should take items out of your gym bag when you return home, ensuring everything has an opportunity to air. It would be recommended to replace your gym bag when you can no longer get it clean and fresh.

Reusable Water Bottle

Water is essential for any workout and most of us will have a re-useable bottle. However, they can be a hot spot for germs and bacteria. If you do not wash your bottle regularly, bacteria will harbour under the lid and at the bottom of the bottle. 'If you are using a re-useable water bottle you should wash it out daily. Bottle brushes will also help clean the inside base of the bottle and scrub around the cap. Putting the bottle in a dishwasher upside down usually kills all bacteria.

2022 YEARS 7 TO 9 ACTIVITIES WEEK

The year 7 to 9 activities week at the end of last year allowed students to engage in a variety of curriculum led activities run by faculty groups, as well as a range of excursions to finish off the year. Excursions included the Treehouse Adventure Centre, Oatmill Cinema, Kaboom Ten Pin Bowling, the Rail Lands and Aquatics Day at the Nangwarry Swimming Pool.

2023 SPORTING CARNIVALS

Swimming Carnival (week 3)

We look forward to the return of our whole school Swimming Carnival, after having to conduct modified carnivals for the last two years. Our carnival will take place on Wednesday15 February at the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre (outdoor 50m pool area).

Upon entry to the venue, students will be required to pay \$5.00 in cash. Students are asked to meet at Wulanda at 8.40am to ensure the carnival can commence on time. Bus students requiring transportation from Mount Gambier High School to Wulanda are asked to meet at the front bus shelter by 8.30am. Students will be dismissed from Wulanda at the conclusion of our carnival at 3.15pm unless they require transportation back to school to catch their regular bus. Bus students returning to school will leave Wulanda at 3.00pm. Students wishing to remain at Wulanda will need to exit the venue before re-entering via the main entry as community members. Entry fees will then apply.

Students will participate in a range of championship swimming events (freestyle, breaststroke, backstroke and relays), as well as a number of novelty activities (Tug O War, Pool Noodle and Boogie Board relays, and Cornhole).

For our carnival, we encourage all participants and spectators to come dressed in sun-smart house colours (Gambier – Yellow, Lake – Blue, Mount – Red and Tower – Black) to add to the fun and atmosphere on the day.

A barbecue will be provided at a small cost: Sausages \$2.50, Hamburgers \$3.50, Vegie burgers \$4.00. Food from the Canteen will be limited and students are encouraged to bring their own food and drink for the day if they do not wish to purchase from the barbecue.

Interhouse Athletics Carnival (Week 5)

This year our Athletics Carnival will be held during week 5. On Monday 27 February during Impact/Homegroup, students will compete in the 1500m event, followed by the remaining track and field events on Thursday 2 and Friday 3 March. The carnival is another wonderful opportunity for students to get together, challenge themselves and have a fun time competing whilst trying to win the 'lan Gould House Shield'.

There are a range of events to suit everyone from the traditional track and field events, to novelties, including sack races, tunnel ball and Tug O War. Last year Tower went back-to-back winning the 'lan Gould Athletics Shield', so the challenge is out for another house to step up and knock them off in 2023.

Interschool Athletics (Week 8) and Adelaide Athletics (Week 10)

Last year as the host school, we were successful in winning the South East Zone Interschool Athletics Shield. This year the competition will be held at Millicent High School on Friday 24 March (week 8). Selection for this event comes from students who perform well at our Interhouse Athletics Carnival. After competing in Millicent, students then have the opportunity to travel to Adelaide for the School Sport SA Athletics Championships. This year will see us compete in division A2 on Wednesday 5 April (week 10). For both events, we will transport students to and from the locations.

Berri (formerly Glossop) Exchange (Term 2, week 10)

After conducting modified exchanges due to COVID-19 restrictions over the past three years, we are keen to return to the normal format which will see our staff and students travel to the Riverland to be hosted by the Berri Regional Secondary College community in Week 10 next term. Planning between both schools is underway to determine the program and sports to be included.

The Berri Exchange is the longest running Public High Schools Exchange in Australia and requires significant support from both communities, including families willing to open their homes for travelling students. As we recommence this cultural exchange, it is a timely reminder for Mount Gambier High School families to consider billeting opportunities for next year when it is our turn to again host the exchange in Mount Gambier. More information will be provided in due course regarding the exchange with team nominations and selection trials occurring in term 2.

MATERIALS & SERVICES CHARGES

In establishing the fees for 2023 both the Finance Advisory Committee and Governing Council are sensitive to the fact that some families may require assistance in meeting this commitment and therefore we are once again offering an instalment plan together with a variety of payment options.

Materials and Services Rebate

In 2022 the Malinauskas Labor Government made a commitment to eligible South Australian families with school-age children to receive a \$100.00 rebate on their public school's Materials and Services Charge for each child for the next two school years (2022 and 2023).

Accordingly, a credit note for \$100.00 has been raised and was enclosed with your statement. The instalment amounts set out below are reflective of the reduced amount of \$370.00.






