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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome back to what will be a busy term with several new initiatives being implemented at the school.

We also welcome back Karen Jared from leave. Karen will resume teaching Science in the Middle Years.



This term our focus will be on the implementation of a new 'Behaviour Support Policy'. Much work has already been done with both staff and students which has been based on feedback provided by students in the many forums we have conducted to date. We still have a number of these to go, with our middle school students being provided with the opportunity to have their say over the next two weeks. I would like to acknowledge our student leaders who have facilitated many of these sessions.

Our new policy is based on the premise that good behaviour management provides students with a choice by making clear the consequences that result from particular behaviours to enable them to begin accepting responsibility for their behaviours. Students need opportunities to alter inappropriate behaviour and learn from their error of judgement in the safe environment of a school. Our newly agreed 'Code of Conduct' will be discussed and referred to regularly with students. A "step" system will be used, when appropriate, so that students can exercise a choice about continuing inappropriate behaviour before a consequence occurs. These steps will be made clear to all students and will be highly visible in classrooms.

We hope to have our draft policy tabled at Governing Council in week 4 with the view to implementing it as soon as possible, following consultation and feedback from staff. The ratified policy and revised 'Code of Conduct' will be uploaded to our website to ensure all parents/caregivers are fully informed. The community will be informed as to when this will be implemented via Daymap or in our next newsletter.

Our second priority is that of literacy. Our achievement data reveals that whilst there are students who can read, they have difficulty comprehending what they are reading. Our teachers as well as support staff, are exploring high impact strategies to support students who possess such difficulties. Students may already be noticing changes in teacher practice in their classes as we explore what works based on national and international research.

All teachers will also be actively promoting a positive attitude towards numeracy across all subject areas. Research has shown that when students develop and demonstrate positive attributes, skills, and mindset towards mathematics & numeracy their results improve in this subject area. This is particularly true when they understand and are able to articulate the numeracy in different subject areas and contexts applying their skills to real life situations.

ANZAC DAY



SPORTING NEWS



ADELAIDE ATHLETICS

After competing in the SEZ Interschool Competition in Millicent, 47 students travelled to Adelaide in week 10 last term to compete in the School Sport SA Athletics Division A2 Competition. The statewide competition allows us to compete against a variety of powerhouse public and private schools. This year we took up a team of 47 students that competed across 123 events. This was a tremendous effort for our students to spread themselves out amongst such a high number of events where other schools had double the number of students to draw from. This alone speaks volumes on the huge effort and 'ticker' that our students have.

We are very proud of all our team who displayed fantastic perseverance and sportsmanship across the day. Our girls placed first, second or third in eight individual events and the boys competed strongly throughout the day, placing in 24 individual events, including 10 firsts. Four of our students achieved individual standards on the day, which

places them in the top 5% of competitors across the six days of the statewide competition, which is an amazing effort. Overall, our team finished 7^{th} and will be competing in the B1 Competition in 2024.
