#### Preparations for 2024

late to school each day from year 7 on equals five days absent per term. This means missing over half a year of schooling by the end of year 12. Students who are late miss the getting organised part of the day and tend to spend the rest of the day trying to catch up. Furthermore, often there is unnecessary pressure placed on the teacher in order to try and catch the student up. This can take time away from the remainder of the class. Students arriving late to school must have a note from their parents/caregivers outlining the reason for the lateness. I ask that parents support the school by ensuring their child arrives at school on time and prepared for lessons. We will be monitoring and following up patterns of regular lateness to determine the reasons and to establish processes to support the students in order to maximise their learning.

# END OF YEAR EQUIPMENT Returns (1) (2)

Year 12 students with school issued equipment including laptops, bags, chargers and textbooks must return all items prior to Friday 17 November 2023. Year 12 students returning in 2024 must have subject selections in place and negotiate keeping school issued equipment with the ICT or CLC teams (dependent on equipment type).

Year 7 to 11 students returning to school in 2024 may hold onto their ICT equipment until next year, however all text books and other school borrowed items need to be returned by the last day of Year 11 Exams - 29 November 2023 (year 11s) and Friday 8 December 2023 (years 7 to 10).

Accounts will be sent home for any equipment not returned to the school.
