END OF YEAR EQUIPMENT

Year 12 students with school issued equipment including laptops, bags, chargers and textbooks must return all items prior to Friday 17 November 2023. Year 12 students returning in 2024 must have subject selections in place and negotiate keeping school issued equipment with the ICT or CLC teams (dependent on equipment type).

Year 7 to 11 students returning to school in 2024 may hold onto their ICT equipment until next year, however all text books and other school borrowed items need to be returned by the last day of Year 11 Exams - 29 November 2023 (year 11s) and Friday 8 December 2023 (years 7 to 10).

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YEAR 12 END OF YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

Year 12 Farewell Assembly

A final assembly to acknowledge the Class of 2023 will be held on Monday, 30 October 2023 during lesson 2.

Last Official Day

Please note the last official day for year 12 students is Thursday, 2 November 2023. In subjects where students have no exams, they may be required to attend sessions with their teachers beyond the last official day to complete final assignments. This will be at the discretion of their subject teachers.

Year 12 Breakfast

The school has organised a year 12 breakfast for staff and students on the morning of Friday, 3 November from 7.45am until 9.15am at the Mount Gambier RSL. This will be a cooked breakfast at a cost of \$15 per person to be paid to the Student Office by Friday 27 October. Please inform the Student Office of any dietary requirements at the time of payment. There will be no formal lessons scheduled on this day. Students will not be permitted at school after the breakfast unless they are fully engaged in a study program. If students wish to study or meet with teachers they are expected to be in full school dress code. Inappropriate behaviours on this day will have consequences applied in line with the school's Behaviour Management Policy. This may include exclusion from exams and the Year 12 Formal in November.

Final Exams

Exams begin on Monday, 6 November with the last exam held on Tuesday, 14 November 2023. Full school dress code is required during exams and no mobile phones or smart watches will be permitted. Exams will occur on the SACE Floor, as well as rooms 23 and 32 as required. For all electronic exams, students must ensure their laptop is fully charged and they bring headphones where required.

Year 12 Formal

The school year will conclude with the Year 12 Formal to be held at the Barn Palais on Saturday, 18 November. This will be our official recognition of the completion of students' schooling and is an opportunity for students, parents/caregivers and staff to celebrate together. The order form for photographs is enclosed.

Presentation & Performance Night

This will be held at the Italo Australian Club (Casadio Park) on Monday, 11 December 2023. This is the school's formal celebration and showcase of student achievement for 2023. We encourage award winners and performers to attend this important event on our school calendar.

Student Achievement Record

All students concluding their studies are entitled to a Student Achievement Record (SAR). This will only be available on request. Students requiring an SAR are asked to speak with their home group teacher to let them know they are requesting an SAR and are then to collect the SAR form from the Student Office. Please complete all relevant forms and return them to home group teachers by Thursday, 2 November. The SAR will be posted home before the end of Term 4.

Laptop Returns

Students will need to return their school laptop to the IT Office by Friday, 17 November.

Book Returns

All books are to be returned to the Collaborative Learning Centre by Friday, 17 November.

Lockers

Students are asked to clean out lockers and return keys or remove locks by Friday, 17 November.

Destination Survey

Exams

Exams will be held from Monday 27 November to Wednesday 29 November on the SACE Floor.

Room 29 will act as the study floor if students choose to come in and prepare for exams. Students will be required to record their attendance on the sign-in sheet.

Students will be offered a debrief lesson to collect and review their exams. Subject teachers will let students know when they will be available in their classroom for the first half of their scheduled lesson time to meet with students during Thursday 30 November and Friday 1 December of Week 7.
