The competition included over 500 teams from Metro Adelaide, Whyalla Region, Limestone Coast, Queensland and Victoria, with only the top 10% of teams making it to the finals.

Our team completed the challenges first in just 1 hour and 28 minutes, taking home back-to-back National Championships!














PRESENTATION & PERFORMANCE **NIGHT**

Students from the Stage 1 Biology B - Environmental Focus class had the opportunity to head out into the field.
