#### School Uniform

Over the past two years Mount Gambier High School has been working through a change-over period between the old 'Dress Code' and a new 'Uniform Policy'. From the beginning of 2024 it will be an expectation that all students attending Mount Gambier High School will be dressed in the Lowes Australia uniform, found in store or on their website. This is an exclusive range of uniform items that reflect the 'needs and wants' of students, parents/caregivers and the Governing Council.

As we transition into this new expectation for 2024, we highly recommend that families begin to source uniform items from Lowes. ### Non-compliance with the Uniform Policy

If students are found to be out of school uniform from the start of 2024, parents will be contacted to bring appropriate clothing or footwear to enable their child to change. If this is not possible due to other commitments students will be loaned uniform items from the Student Office for the day. Students may also not be permitted to participate in learning activities, events or excursions due to incorrect uniform. Where family circumstances make it difficult to comply with the policy, contact should be made with the appropriate Student Wellbeing Coordinator or Head of School to explore avenues for support.

The Mount Gambier High School team emerged as the champions, catching five carp and snagging the 'Shak Von Stanke, Holy Carp Cup' for 2023! Holy Carp originated in 2020, when a group of students decided to tackle the pesky problem of invasive species - the European Carp in the Valley Lake.
