FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome all to the start of the 2024 school year at Mount Gambier High School. A special welcome to new students and their families. I am looking forward to getting to know you and your children, and together with our staff, help make



a difference with their learning, care and development.

2024 is an important year as we look to consolidate and build on the excellent work of the school in supporting students, staff and families. Much work was carried out last year including: the development of a revised Student Behaviour Support Process in consultation with the students and a new Teaching and Learning Agreement for staff to ensure students experience consistency in how they are being taught. As well we had an unrelenting focus on improving the reading comprehension of our students, which again, will be our primary focus for this year.

COVID-19

Whilst it may feel like a long time ago, COVID-19 is still active in Mount Gambier and surrounds. Can I remind parents that if you child tests positive for COVID-19, the school must be notified and they must stay home for five days.

Congratulations

I congratulate all 2023 Year 12 students on their results last year. We have witnessed significant improvement in achievement, this being attributed to not only the hard work and dedication of our students but the teachers as well. Details of our results can be found in the 2023 SACE Results Booklet (located at the end of this newsletter or on our website), however a special mention and congratulations must be extended to Amber Thompson as the 2023 recipient of the prestigious Elizabeth Phillips Scholarship (Dux of School) with an Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking (ATAR) of 95.25. This is an exceptional accomplishment and is the result of Amber's dedication to her studies.

I would also like to congratulate the significant number of students who also completed certificate level studies as part of their SACE providing them with pathways not only to university but to employment as well. I wish all our 2023 students the best of luck for the future in whatever pathway you choose.

Attendance Expectations

Students are expected to be in class during normal school hours. This includes arriving to class by the second bell, with all appropriate learning materials. The requirements are that students remain in class at all times unless permission has been granted by the classroom teacher. Regular attendance supports relationship building with both the teacher and fellow students, whilst providing learning opportunities. Further to this, we have a duty of care requirement to fulfil and cannot do this when students choose to wilfully truant class.

Governing Council

Our Governing Council AGM will be held on Thursday March 7 (week 6), beginning at 6.00pm in the CLC and I would encourage parents to attend if you would like to be involved in our Governing Council for 2024.

Our Governing Council (GC) plays a very important part in school decision making. Being on the GC is one way to be involved in the partnership held between you and the school for your child's education. By being on GC you are also giving some extra time to share your interest in your own child's education and the education of all the students in this school.

The Governing Council gives advice to the Principal and specifically makes

decisions to do with: school policies; finance; fundraising; grounds and buildings; hire of facilities; sports; uniforms and dress codes; and the general safety and educational welfare of the students.

For a GC to be effective it needs to have access to the range of views held by groups of parents in a school community. Diversity is considered when raising issues and making decisions. That is why our GC membership needs to reflect the range of needs and aspirations held by parents in our school.

At each meeting, the Principal and staff make reports and always raise and respond to topics about the educational program provided at the school. The GC members who hold responsibility for various roles (e.g. Finance or canteen) share their ideas and make proposals. There is also the opportunity for members to ask questions about the school and to report the attitudes of the community.

Previous GC members have reported that they enjoy being on GC because:

- You get to have your say
- You hear what other people think
- You become well informed about what is happening
- You get to know other parents
- You get to understand how the school works
- You learn how things "fit together" at school.

The current GC is especially keen for parents who have previously not been involved in GC, parents from various cultural groups and/or parents who have younger children in the school, to think about joining GC for the first time. If you are interested and would like more information about the role and responsibilities of the GC please contact me. I would be more than happy to explain the important part you play as a council member in your child's life and the life of the school. Please also encourage others to join.

Swimming Carnival (week 3)

This year, we are back for our annual Swimming Carnival which will be held on Wednesday 14 February at Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre (outdoor 50m pool area).

Upon entry to the venue, students will be required to pay \$5.00 in cash. Students are asked to meet at Wulanda at 8.40am to ensure the carnival can commence on time. Bus students requiring transportation from Mount Gambier High School to Wulanda are asked to meet at the front bus shelter by 8.30am. Students will be dismissed from Wulanda at the conclusion of our carnival at 3.15pm unless they require transportation back to school to catch their regular bus. Bus students returning to school will leave Wulanda at 3.00pm. Students wishing to remain at Wulanda will need to exit the venue before re-entering via the main entry as community members. Entry fees will then apply.

Students will participate in a range of championship swimming events (freestyle, breaststroke, backstroke and relays), as well as a number of novelty activities (Tug O War, Pool Noodle and Boogie Board relays, and Cornhole). For our carnival, we encourage all participants and spectators to come dressed in sun-smart house colours (Gambier – Yellow, Lake – Blue, Mount – Red and Tower – Black) to add to the fun and atmosphere on the day. A sausage sizzle will also be provided (Sausages \$2.50). Food from the canteen will be limited and students are encouraged to bring their own food and drink for the day if they do not wish to purchase from the barbecue.

Interhouse Athletics Carnival (Week 5)

This year our Athletics Carnival will be held during week 5. On Monday 26 February during Impact/Homegroup, students will compete in the 1500m event, followed by the remaining track and field events on Thursday 29 February and Friday 1 March. The carnival is another wonderful opportunity for students to get together, challenge themselves and have a fun time competing whilst trying to win the 'lan Gould House Shield'.

There are a range of events to suit everyone from the traditional track and field events to novelties including sack races, tunnel ball and Tug O War. Last year Tower went three peat winning the 'lan Gould Athletics Shield', so the challenge is out for another house to step up and knock them off in 2024.

Interschool Athletics (Week 8) and Adelaide Athletics (Week 10)

This year the annual Interschool Athletics competition will be held at Marist Park, with Tenison Woods College hosting on Wednesday 20 March (week 8). Selection for this event comes from students who perform well at our Interhouse Athletics Carnival. After competing locally, students then have the opportunity to travel to Adelaide for the School Sport SA Athletics Championships. This year will see us compete in division B1 on Thursday 4 April (week 10). For both events, we will transport students to and from the locations.\

2024 MATERIALS & SERVICES CHARGES

In establishing the fees for 2024 both the Finance Advisory Committee and Governing Council are sensitive to the fact that some families may require assistance in meeting this commitment and therefore we are once again offering an instalment plan together with a variety of payment options.

Materials and Services Rebate

In 2022 the Malinauskas Labor Government made a commitment to eligible South Australian families with school-age children to receive a \$100.00 rebate on their public school's Materials and Services Charge for each child for 2022 and 2023. This has subsequently been approved for 2024 as part of the Government's commitment to families.

The instalment amounts set out below are reflective of the reduced amount of \$370.00.

- 12.5% of the eligible cohort achieved an ATAR of 80 or above (top 20% of the state).
- 43% of students achieved one or more A grades.
- Amber McCleave received a Merit in Digital Communication Solutions (a merit is the highest subject achievement possible.
